Knowledge and Understanding	
A1	Have an advanced and thorough understanding of parts of Scripture, their relation to the whole, and how to interpret them

<b>A2</b>	Have a systematic and advanced understanding of selected doctrines of the Christian faith, and/or periods of church history and historical theology, and their significance for the contemporary church, both locally and globally
<b>A3</b>	Have an advanced understanding of how the Christian faith engages with various contemporary ethical and pastoral issues
<b>A4</b>	Have an advanced understanding of the interconnectedness of the various elements within the study of biblical studies and theology
<b>A5</b>	Have a thorough understanding of the methodological, philosophical and hermeneutical models and assumptions used in the study of theology
<b>Cognitive (Thinking) Skills</b>	
<b>B1</b>	Demonstrate a practical understanding of how established techniques of research and enquiry are used to create and interpret knowledge within the discipline, along with an ability to choose the most appropriate techniques for any given task
<b>B2</b>	Critically and reflectively evaluate advanced scholarship in the theological disciplines, applying a variety of critical methods, assessing views and theories and, where appropriate, proposing alternatives
<b>B3</b>	Evaluate methodologies employed in the theological disciplines and develop appropriate critiques of them
<b>B4</b>	Construct and articulate an integrative, coherent, well-informed, critically-engaged and sustained argument and develop original application of the knowledge and understanding it contains
<b>B5</b>	Appreciate and be able to deal systematically and creatively with complex issues and make sound judgements, sometimes in the absence of complete data
<b>B6</b>	Engage and interact at a high level with the material/subjects studied, demonstrating an ability to reflect critically on their own particular standpoint and to understand the methodological and hermeneutical issues involved
<b>B7</b>	Demonstrate competence in postgraduate research skills through a substantial dissertation (or a short dissertation and a short project)
