A1	<i>Practical &amp; Pastoral Ministry:</i> A growing personal awareness of self in relation to God and others, and a basic understanding of ecclesiological perspectives and some local and global ministry practices
A2	<i>Culture:</i> A comprehension of the concepts of worldview and theological anthropology and a basic understanding of some aspects of global and cultural history and horizons

<b>A3</b>	<i>Biblical Studies:</i> A ready knowledge of the span of the whole Bible, an informed grasp of some exegetical approaches to biblical texts and genres, and a growing awareness of different hermeneutical methods
<b>A4</b>	<i>History:</i> An introductory knowledge of aspects of global church history and an understanding of the significance of select figures, events and texts in Christian history
<b>A5</b>	<i>Doctrine:</i> A foundational understanding of the biblical basis of and need for doctrine in church ministry, mission and discipleship and a basic knowledge of some key doctrines

<b>B1</b>	<i>Practical &amp; Pastoral Ministry:</i> Communicate the Bible accurately and reflectively, describe and evaluate models of church life and discipleship, and apply some of these insights to self and others
<b>B2</b>	<i>Culture:</i> Describe and evaluate varied accounts of worldview, anthropology, mission and cultural dynamics, and communicate and justify those judgements
<b>B3</b>	<i>Biblical Studies:</i> Analyse and evaluate selected biblical texts with essential exegetical skills and in relation to their historical-cultural and narrative-theological contexts, communicate these accurately, and describe the strengths and weaknesses of hermeneutical reflexes
<b>B4</b>	<i>History:</i> Draw on historical awareness and modes of inquiry, identify key historical figures, contexts and debates, and engage and evaluate the significance of these for Christian life and ministry
<b>B5</b>	<i>Doctrine:</i> Identify and describe presuppositions as well as some doctrinal debates, contexts and <i>loci</i> , and explain and engage with theological consequence
<b>B6</b>	<i>Programme Learning:</i> Outline an author's argument in primary and secondary sources, engage in basic research and enquiry, communicate in written/verbal form and engage in active listening
<b>B7</b>	<i>Life-Long Learning:</i> Use appropriately some digital tools, gather and analyse relevant information in light of a task
<b>B8</b>	<i>Independent &amp; Collaborative Learning:</i> Set goals and take initiative for personal progress and collaborate with others in view of a project or task
